# World Class Infrastructure



## Classrooms

The multimedia-enabled classrooms are spacious and air-conditioned. These are equipped with over-head LCD projectors, public address system, internet facility and laptop power supply.

## Computing Facilities

KIIT offers sophisticated computing environment with access to a powerful network of resources and applications. The ICT cell equips the campus with state-of-the-art networking facilities in a single loop with wireless internet connectivity by utilizing technologies such as VoIP, video conferencing, video streaming, and wireless LAN. ## Seminar Hall & Moot Court

The School has an air-conditioned seminar hall with a seating capacity for 200 people. Additionally, the School has a huge moot court room and students are expected to take part in simulated court proceedings, which usually include drafting briefs and oral arguments. KLS has a very tough and competitive internal moot court competition in order to select the students who represent KLS at the various international and national moot court competitions. The School has its own National Moot Court Competition, which witnesses participation of major law schools from across the country.

## Medical Facilities

KIIT has its own ultra-modern multi-specialty 2,600 bedded hospital. Besides providing medical checkups to the students every year, the School covers students under KIIT mediclaim policy.

## Sports Facilities

A centrally located indoor stadium provides facilities for all indoor games such as table tennis, carom, and snooker. Outdoor facilities for games such as cricket, basketball, tennis and baseball are also available in the campus itself.



## Hostel Facilities

The school provides on-campus residential facilities to its students. Separate hostel facilities are available for boys and girls with modern amenities and 24 hours internet connectivity conducive to a professional work ambience. ## Library

The KLS library is one of the most comprehensive law libraries in India and undeniably one of the most attractively designed. The 24X7 library is spread across 3 floors, having 22792 books, and having an annual budget of over Rupees 1 crore, the library contains a rich collection of printed as well as electronic resources which include books, journals, back volume of journals and reports, databases, audiovisual materials, CD's, e-journals, annual reports of top companies, case studies, conference proceedings, standards and patents etc., and is regarded as one of the best libraries amongst all law schools in India. We have a separate e-library for accessing the online database, within the premises of the library. KLS presently offers access to different online legal databases viz. Westlaw Asia, Lexis Nexis (advance), JSTOR, Hein Online, Manupatra, SCC Online, AIR online etc. We also provide online access to EBC reader and E-Brary (e-books platform) to our valued users.



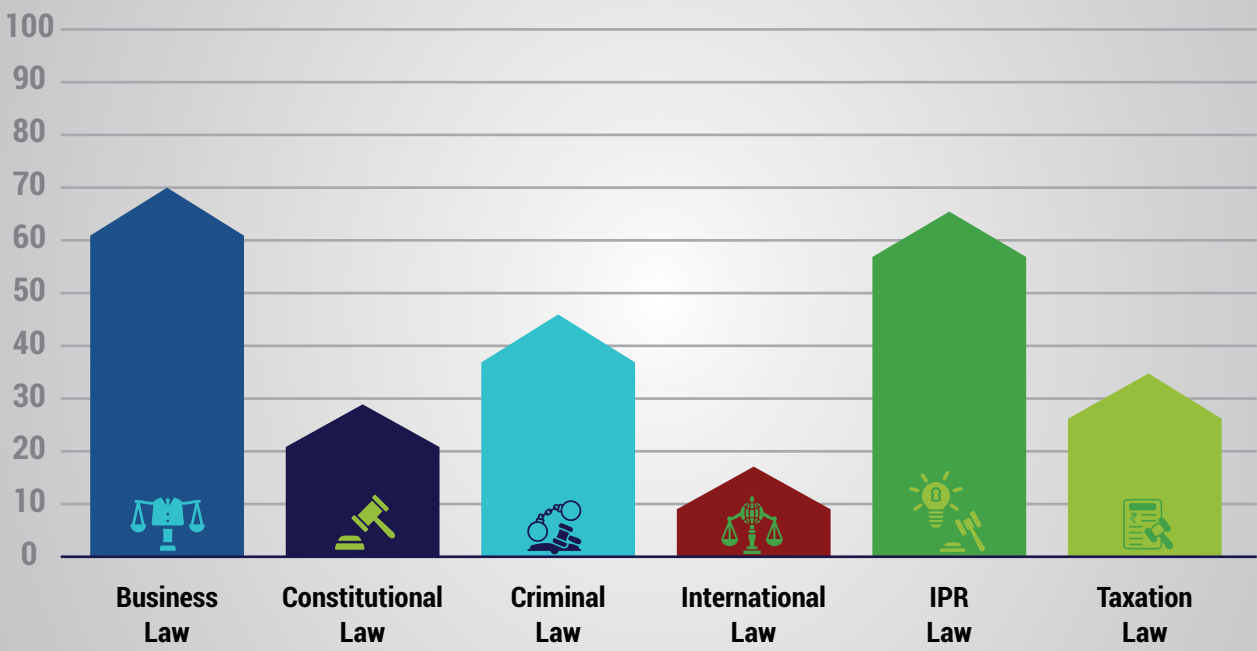

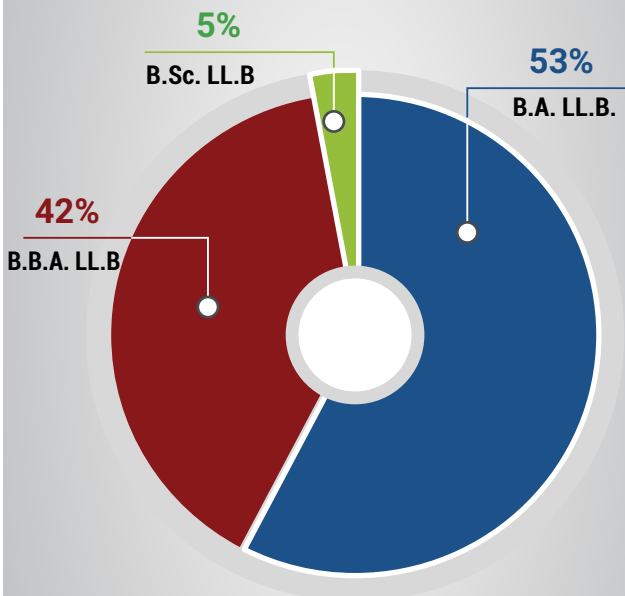

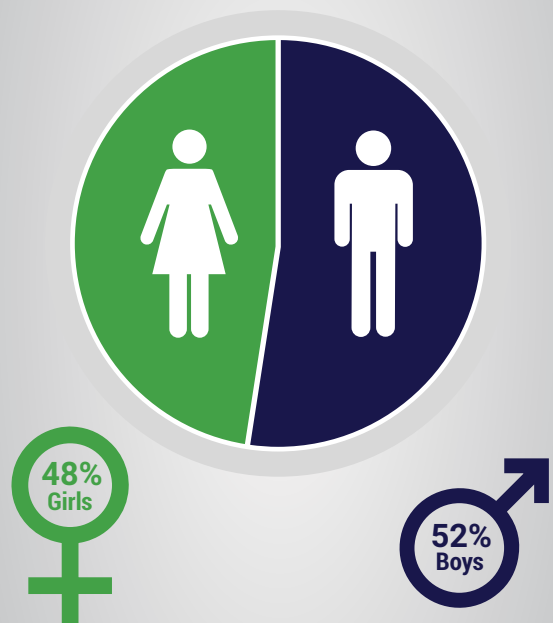

# Internship & Placement Program
